## **Mayer Brown**



The U.S. Supreme Court's May decision in Impression Products Inc. v. Lexmark International Inc. marked a major win for Mayer Brown, which came in a case that could affect millions of companies and consumers in the secondary market for patented products.

Mayer Brown represented Impression Products, a West Virginia company that buys used ink cartridges made by manufacturer Lexmark and, after refurbishing them, sells them on the secondary market.

The practice of reselling the cartridges at a significantly lower price alarmed Lexmark, which sued Impression Products and other resellers for patent infringement arising from the purchase and resale of cartridges in the U.S. and abroad. Every defendant settled except Impression Products.

Applying the doctrine of patent exhaustion, which limits a patentee's exclusive right to make and sell a patented product, the Supreme Court held that a patentee could not impose patent-based restrictions on the use of a product after domestic and foreign sales. The justices threw out two Federal Circuit rules that kept some patent rights in place even after sales.

Paul Theiss, chairman of Mayer Brown, praised its appellate practice as a longtime "hallmark" of the firm. He said the win for Impression Products showed how its appellate group performs in some of the most important business cases that sit before the country's highest court each term.

"It's a great example of teamwork between our appellate practice and our superb intellectual property practice to bring about a great result for the client," Theiss said. "And not only the client, but the entire industry."

Mayer Brown won Practice Group of the Year awards in the Appellate, Banking, Class Action, Consumer Protection, Food & Beverage, Intellectual Property, Project Finance and Tax categories.
