3) FATCA: ARE YOU READY??

On July 1, 2014 FATCA goes into effect and with that, new rules that require A TON of new filings and a lot of substantiation for all companies – not just financial services firms. If companies are not prepared and providing supportable information, financial institutions or other persons may begin to withhold tax under the FATCA provisions. There is no ability to get a refund for these taxes. The session will focus on what inbound groups are doing to ensure adequate compliance and what the best practice approaches are when dealing with FATCA.
