On March 27, 2014, the Seventh Circuit issued a major ruling in *Motorola Mobility LLC v. AU Optronics* that may narrow the reach of U.S. antitrust laws where the alleged anticompetitive conduct occurred overseas. Appeals raising similar arguments under the Foreign Trade Antitrust Improvements Act are pending before the Second and Ninth Circuits.
