## Speaker Highlights



**Erica Chan** is the Senior Vice President and General Counsel for Walmart Asia. She is responsible for handling all legal matters relating to the company in Asia. Chan ensures the company's compliance with the laws and regulations in the countries it operates in Asia and works with the senior management on business strategy and initiatives. She is very supportive of the women's economic empowerment initiative at Walmart. Prior to Walmart, Chan was in the STAR Group, a News Corporation subsidiary where she was the General Counsel, Greater China and the General Manager of the Hong Kong Office. In her 13 years with the Star Group, Chan oversaw the Chinese language content acquisition and distribution including the Fortune Star Library and Star Chinese Movies businesses. She was also responsible for contract and transaction negotiations across Asia, Europe and North America. Chan has many years experience across corporate law and operational transactions including joint ventures, acquisitions and disposals, company restructurings, intellectual property and operations in the Asia Pacific region, Middle East, US and Europe. In 2007, Asian Legal Business Magazine awarded the STAR in house legal team as the Best In-House Media Lawyer Team. Chan has a Bachelors Degree from the Chinese University of Hong Kong, has completed her Common Professional Examination (in Law) from the University of Sussex, and holds a Post Graduate Certificate in Law from the University of Hong Kong. She is admitted to practice as a solicitor in Hong Kong. She speaks English, Putonghua and Cantonese. ***Ms. Chan will present opening remarks.***



**Jin Yu** is Partner in McKinsey & Company's Beijing Office and heads their Talent and Leadership Development service line in China. She is the most senior Chinese female Partner at McKinsey and leads the firm on strategic development of talent and leadership capabilities. In addition to her work with clients, Yu serves on the core faculty of McKinsey's training programs for senior consultants and provides personal coaching and mentoring. She is the co-leader of McKinsey's Young Women Leaders Initiative, a unique program that provides tailored coaching and mentoring programs for outstanding young women at China's top universities. Born in China, Jin Yu earned her doctorate in economics from the California Institute of Technology. She lives with her husband and two children in Beijing. ***Ms. Yu is the Facilitator and Moderator of the program.***





**Agnes Chan** is the Managing Partner of Ernst & Young for Hong Kong and Macau. She has over 25 years of experience providing tax and business advisory services to a broad range of local and multinational organizations. Her scope of expertise includes tax restructuring for IPOs; regional and cross border tax planning; corporate restructuring; and tax efficient supply chain management planning. Chan is a frequent contributor to newspapers and publications, and is regularly interviewed by the media. She has received recognition as a top tax advisor both in Hong Kong and around the world by the International Tax Review, the Guide to the World's Leading Tax Advisers, and in 2012 received the Best in Tax Individual Award at Euromoney Legal Media Group's Asian Women in Business Law Awards. Chan's government and advisory body roles include: member of the Competition Commission; Environment and Conservation Fund Committee; Hong Kong Inland Revenue Department Users Committee; Hong Kong Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Appeal Board; and Telecommunications Users and Consumers Advisory Committee of the Office of the Communications Authority. She is a member of the Accounting Advisory Board at the University of Hong Kong School of Business; a member of the Advisory Board of the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology Institute for Emerging Market Studies; a council member of the Taxation Institute of Hong Kong; and an adviser of the Tax Committee of the Society of Chinese Accountants and Auditors. Chan is the former chairman of the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce – Taxation Committee. In 2011, Chan was elected as a member of the Election Committee responsible for electing the Chief Executive of Hong Kong. She has been awarded by the Fellowship of Outstanding Women Entrepreneurs in China as one of the Top 100 China Women Entrepreneurs of the Year in 2011 and was the first leader outside Mainland China to be named China Economic Woman of the Year in 2012. Chan is a fellow member of Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants; fellow member of the Taxation Institute of Hong Kong; fellow member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia; and fellow member of CPA Australia. ***Ms. Chan will be featured in Overcoming Obstacles: Authentic Answers.***



**Amita (Dholakia) Chaudhury** is the Global Diversity Director at Unilever. In this role she facilitates the development of Diversity and Inclusion Strategy in partnership with the Global Diversity Board and builds internal capability through knowledge transfer across geographies and enhancing subject matter expertise. She helped to create the Global Diversity Champions group within Unilever, a cross section of diversity and inclusion champions from across the business, across geographies and work levels who are helping to bring a rich palette of inputs to the development of the gender balance agenda in Unilever. During her time leading Diversity and Inclusion in Unilever, the company has become a well recognized leader in Gender balance winning over 20 awards across geographies for creating an enabling environment and performance in the space of recruitment, retention and development of women in the workplace including the 2013 Catalyst award in Gender diversity. Chaudhury has been a management professional for 15 years and has worked in and for Fortune 500 corporations including Unilever, McDonald's and Colgate Palmolive in India, Singapore, Hong Kong and the United Kingdom. She has been nominated for and received awards for outstanding communication both in Unilever and Colgate Palmolive. Chaudhury is also the author of the book, "Working mothers, Happy kids". She has an MBA in Marketing and International Management from Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore and Honors in Mathematics from University of Delhi. ***Ms. Chaudhury will be featured in Maximizing Opportunity: Facing Challenges and Preparing for the Future.***



**Professor Fanny Cheung** is currently Choh-Ming Li Professor of Psychology and Director of the Hong Kong Institute of Asia-Pacific Studies at CUHK. Professor Cheung was appointed Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Research in 2013 and is also Chairperson of the Research Committee at CUHK. An active advocate for promoting women's status through scientific research, Professor Cheung established the Gender Research Centre in 1985, and initiated the Gender Studies Programme at the University. Her efforts have led to an increased awareness of gender issues in academia and the community at large. From 1996 to 1999, Professor Cheung served as the Founding Chairperson of the Hong Kong Equal Opportunities Commission, setting up the mechanism to eliminate discrimination and promote equal opportunities for women and men, and for people with disabilities. Professor Cheung obtained her bachelor's degree in Psychology from the University of California, Berkeley, and PhD in Psychology from the University of Minnesota. Her research expertise lies in cross-cultural personality assessment and psychopathology, gender equality, and women leadership. Professor Cheung is currently President of the International Test Commission, a Fellow and former President of the Hong Kong Psychological Society, a Fellow of the American Psychological Association (APA) and a Fellow at the Association for Psychological Science (APS). Professor Cheung has served on many government committees and advisory bodies, including the Electoral Affairs Commission, the Women's Commission, the Independent Police Complaints Council, the Regional Council, and the Advisory Committee on Social Work Training and Manpower Planning. She was invited as a special delegate to the 7th to the 11th Sessions of the National Congress of Chinese Women. In recognition of her contributions to the community, she was appointed Justice of the Peace in 1988 and a Hong Kong Affairs Advisor from 1995 to 1997. She was made an Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire (OBE) in 1997. Professor Cheung has published and lectured widely and internationally. Her academic publications total over 180 internationally refereed journal articles, book chapters, books and monographs. Her academic honours and awards include the APA Award for Distinguished Contributions to the International Advancement of Psychology 2012, Distinguished International Psychologist Award of APA Division 52 (2005), and Distinguished Leadership Award for Internationals from the University of Minnesota (2003). ***Professor Cheung will be featured in Maximizing Opportunity: Facing Challenges and Preparing for the Future.***



**Fumbi Chima** is an accomplished business executive with exceptional senior management skills in strategic planning, acquisition and business development. As Chief Information Officer for Walmart Asia, she provides vision and leadership for developing and implementing information technology initiatives that align with their objectives. **Lois Freeke** is a British recruitment professional with more than 14 years' experience in China, including over 8 years in China recruitment and operations management. Additionally she has spent 3 years working in Hong Kong and more than 2 years in Australia. Lois has managed teams of up to 65 staff in regional operations management roles with two major Nasdaq listed recruitment firms in China, and previously established a niche and market leading recruitment and outplacement firm. Lois graduated from university in the UK with a Bachelor Degree (Honors) in Literature and Socio History and is a Certified Professional Career Coach and Outplacement Consultant. **Lara Giddings, MP** was Tasmania's 44<sup>th</sup> Premier and first female Premier (January 2011 to March 2014). Initially elected to the Tasmanian Parliament in 1996, at the age of 23, Ms Giddings was the youngest woman ever elected to an Australian Parliament. After losing her House of Assembly seat of Lyons in 1998, she was re-elected to the seat of Franklin in 2002. In March 2004 she was elevated to the front bench as Minister for Economic Development and the Arts. Subsequently, Ms Giddings enjoyed great success across a number of portfolios including, Minister for Health and Human Services, Attorney General and Minister for Justice, Minister for Infrastructure and Economic Development, Deputy Premier, and Treasurer. In these roles she drove reform in Health, Disabilities, Children, Housing, the law (social and governance) and initiated the State's first comprehensive Economic Development Plan. During her period as Premier and Treasurer, Tasmania faced difficult economic and financial conditions demanding strong decisions from the government. With plans in action to diversify the State's economy, Ms Giddings led the way in focussing the Tasmanian business sector and economy towards the opportunities that lay in the Asian Century, particularly in China and Indonesia. In addition to her work, Ms Giddings is a founding member of Emily's List, a national organization that provides financial and mentoring support to progressive Labor women candidates and she is also a founding member of the International Women's Forum in Australia. ***Ms. Giddings will be featured in Lessons from Today's Women Leaders for the Next Generation.***



**Junko Hata** is a Managing Director with the Management Consulting Group at Accenture Japan. Since joining Accenture in 1997, she has moved up the ranks to Manager and Senior Manager until she was promoted to Managing Director in 2010. She has supported projects in a wide variety of industries from manufacturing to finance, and retail to pharmaceutical. Her skill areas include strategy formulation in marketing, corporate business, customer relationship management, new business creation, new product development and more. She has served as Lead of Sales and Marketing Strategy Group in Accenture Japan, creating Points of View for new offerings while helping develop the careers of others. Also during her time with the company, she has been involved with developing programs and promoting internal and external communications as a member of the Accenture Japan Women's Initiatives. She holds a Bachelor of Law degree from Waseda University. **Gabriela Kennedy** is a partner of Mayer Brown JSM and head of the Asia IP and TMT group. She is also co-leader of Mayer Brown's Intellectual Property practice. She is based in Hong Kong, practising intellectual property, media, information technology and telecommunications law. She advises clients on strategic and complex IP matters and transactions, broadcasting regulation and media transactions, information technology outsourcing, data protection and privacy, domain names and telecoms matters and is a renowned leader in both IP and TMT. She has undertaken lobbying work on behalf of a number of international industry associations in relation to IP legislation in Hong Kong notably in relation to changes to copyright laws that advance the protection of digital rights. She has been involved in leading IP and media litigation cases in Hong Kong. A tough litigator and innovator, Gabriela devised a strategy to effectively enforce court orders in Hong Kong against company name hijackers in 2007. This strategy was adopted by other legal practitioners until a later change in the law. Gabriela is a versatile lawyer whose practice combines contentious and transactional matters. Her deep knowledge and understanding of diverse industries and areas of law is an advantage in the fast moving and converged business world of the 21<sup>st</sup> century. Over the years she has received numerous accolades and has been listed as a leading lawyer in her fields in all major legal directories since 2000. A prolific writer, she has authored more than 200 articles on issues concerning IP, information technology, ecommerce and telecommunications law. She is the Asia editor of Computer and Telecommunications Law Review and writes a regular column for Computer Law and Security Report. Gabriela holds an LLM (in Information Technology and Telecoms Law) from the University of Strathclyde where she was retained on the teaching staff upon being awarded her degree with distinction. A former theoretical linguist, Gabriela speaks a number of European languages (French, Italian, Portuguese, Romanian and Spanish) to various degrees of fluency and has been known to use them in her professional life. She sits on a number of boards and her leadership roles span many industries and areas from intellectual property, technology and media to education and the advancement of leadership for women. Gabriela is president of the IWF Hong Kong Forum and has been nominated for the global board of IWF. ***Ms. Kennedy will be featured in Lessons from Today's Women Leaders for the Next Generation.***



**Marie-Josée Lareau** has had an extensive career in the artistic performance world, and is now sharing her experiences through her own company MJLAREAU.com, where she serves as Artistic Director, Speaker, Stage Director & Workshop Leader. In 2002, Lareau completed her university degree in dance and started her own company called Création à l'ENDROIT where she worked as a choreographer and the artistic and founding Director. In 2003, she was recruited by Cirque du Soleil to be the Artistic Coach and in 2006, she became Assistant Choreographer on the show KOOZA. During her ten years at Cirque du Soleil, she also worked as a Conceptor on various projects and was most recently Choreographer and Artistic Coach in charge of Specific Artistic Training. She also worked as Creation Director at C2-MTL and in 2012, as part of the C2-MTL: Commerce & Creativity Conference in Montreal, Lareau led the design for Cirque de Soleil President Daniel Lamarre's presentation, illustrating the organization's creativity and choreographing an acrobatic performance to reflect the content of the conference in a more artistic way. *(cont'd)*

Lareau completed an EMBA at HEC and McGill University. For her final paper, she analyzed how the artistic and business world could collaborate better with the premise that the business world could learn from the cultural world and vice versa. As a result of her research, she started to develop workshops for executives in the business industry. Her workshops have gained wide popularity over time with a list of clients including the Communication and Marketing Department of Cirque du Soleil, The Innovative Center of Bombardier, Walt Disney Creative Center invited by The CRIP (Cirque du Soleil's Research Center), École d'été en management de la création dans la société de l'innovation Montréal-Barcelone, Abbott Laboratories and the employees, new managers and executives of Cirque du Soleil. Lareau is now Innovation Manager at Abbvie. ***Ms. Lareau will lead The Creative Impulse within Us.***



**Mdm. Mu Hong** is Director General of the International Department at the All-China Women's Federation. She graduated from the Foreign Languages and Literature Department of the University of Wuhan in 1984 and received a Master Degree of Law from the Renmin University of China in 1998. From July 1984 to November 2000, she served as deputy division director and division director in the International Department of the China Communist Youth League of China, and Deputy Director-General of the All-China Youth Federation. Prior to becoming Director General of the International Department of the All-China Women's Federation, she served as Director of the Division of Publicity, Division of General Office, and Deputy Director-General. ***Mdm. **Shoba Purushothaman** is an entrepreneur and currently involved in establishing her third start-up, a global enterprise in the technology-led education industry. She has 25 years of business and entrepreneurial experience including leadership and operating roles in the U.S., Europe and Asia in the digital, media, marketing and education sectors. Her experience includes 10 years as CEO of a Tier 1 venture-backed global business based in New York City. Smith joined the Walmart family in 1994 when Walmart entered the Canadian market. She held various roles with the dedicated logistics provider, Supply Chain management. In 2006, she moved to Walmart Canada Home Office as Vice President of Logistics, responsible for managing all warehouse and transportation operations. She assumed responsibility for the start-up of Canada's Perishable DC network as Canada opened its first Supercentre formats. Smith came to China at the end of 2011 and has worked with the team over past 2.5 years to transform Supply Chain to become a strategic advantage for Walmart China.
