

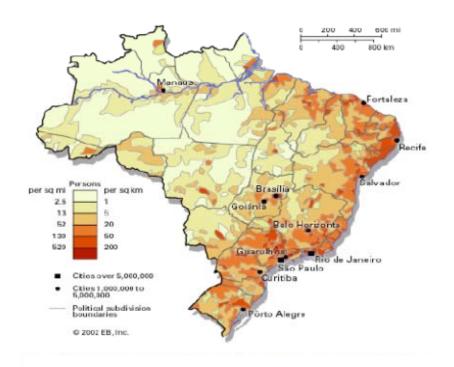

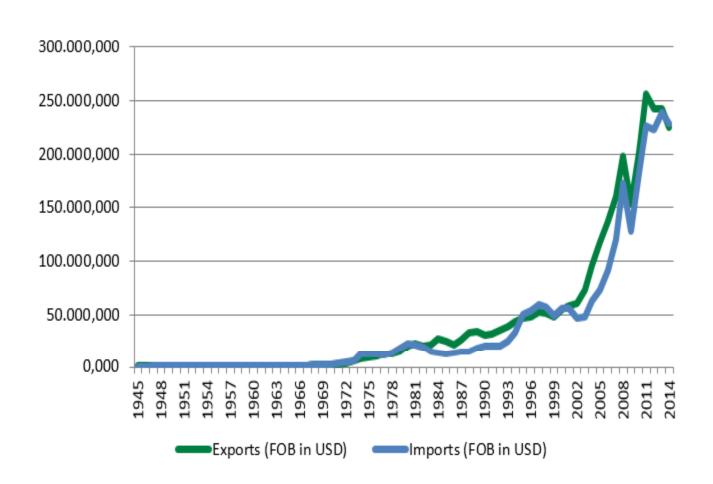
Brazil

- •2014-2015- +9% Brazilian companies exported to US
- •75% of Brazilian products are manufactured or semi manufactures goods
- •Brazil's trade surplus hits December record- Brazil rebounded from a deficit of \$4bn in 2014 to a trade surplus of \$19.7bn last year. In December, the surplus reached \$6.2bn the largest for that month since the data series began in 1980

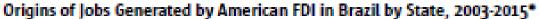
Brazilian Real vs. US Dollar 2010-2015

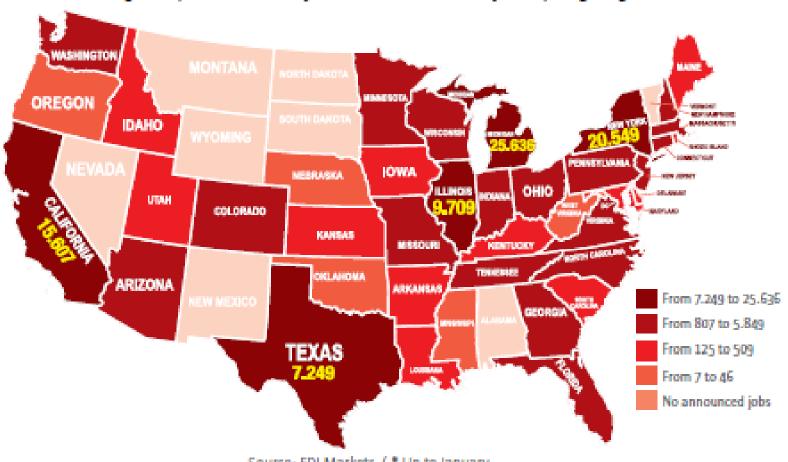

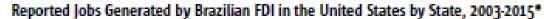
US Investments Creating Jobs in Brazil

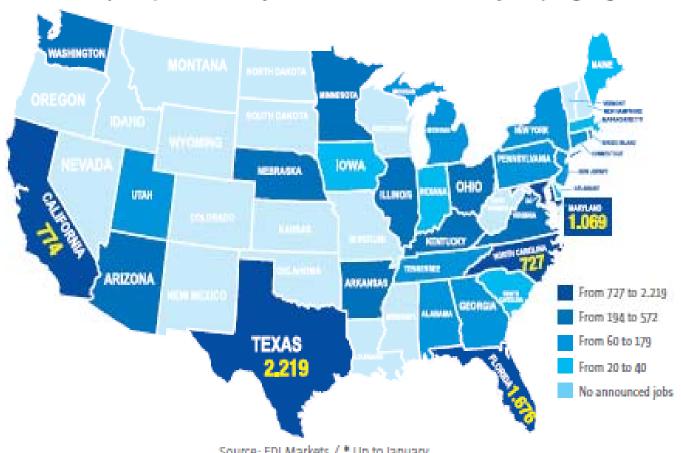

Brazil: A Window of Opportunity?

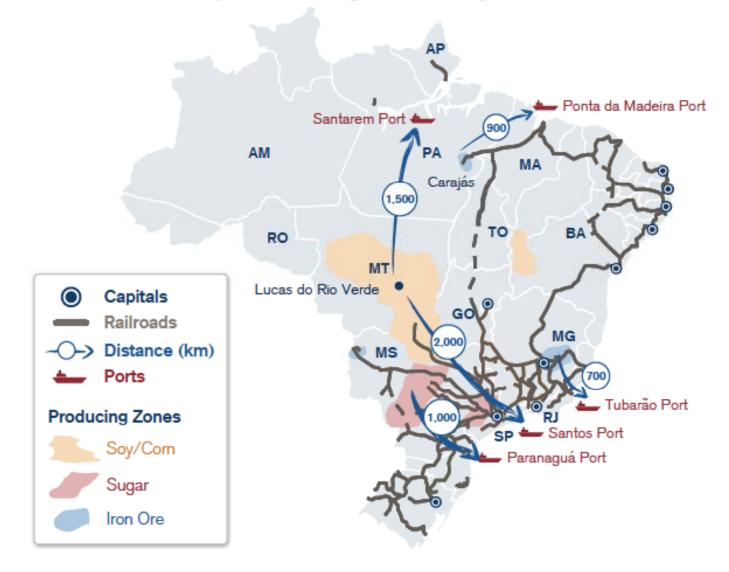
"Brazil is on Sale," Says Businessman Abilio Diniz in an Event in New York.

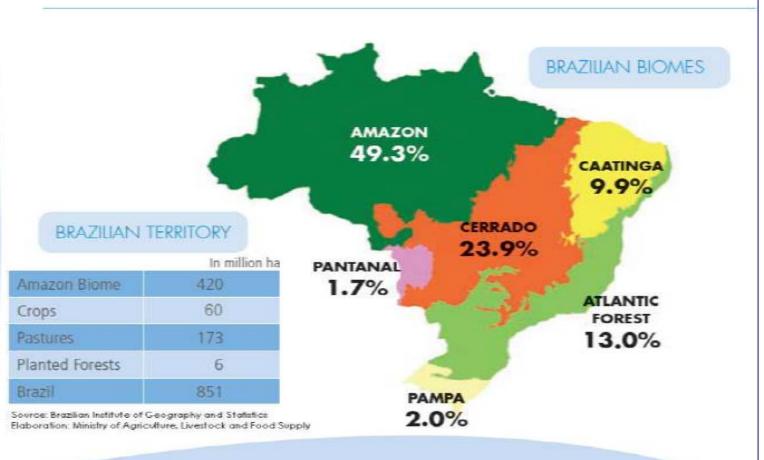

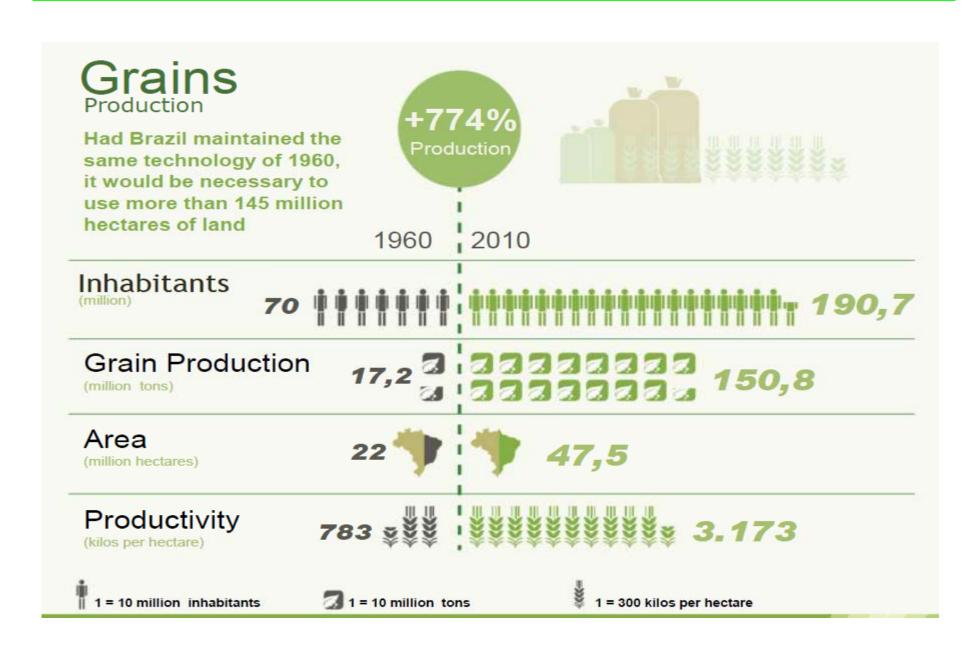

Increase in grain production over the last 20 years has been a result of high levels of productivity.

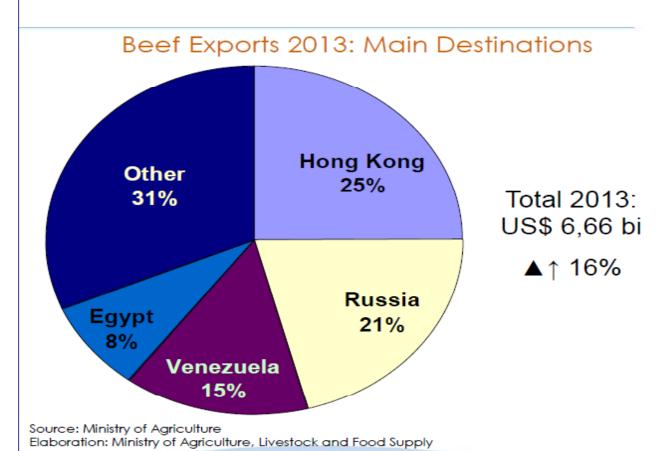
Grain volume has almost tripled in the period, while the harvested area has grown only 40%. Productivity in the area, therefore, doubled.

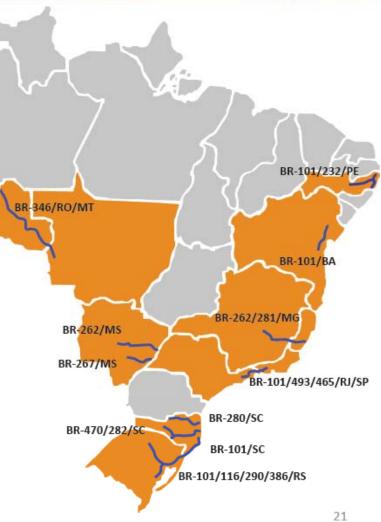

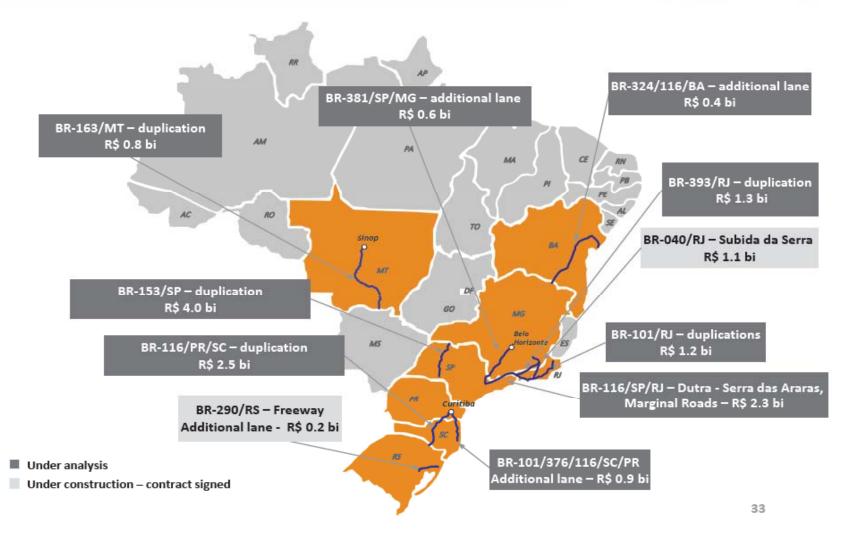

Opportunities in Airports

- Largest air transportation system in Latin America
- •10 out of the 20 busiest airports in the region
- •109 million passengers in 2013
- •12% traffic growth (CAGR compounded annual growth rate) in the last decade
- •126 destinations served and 994,700 domestic flights and 138,900 international; relatively small number compared to other continental countries.
- Airfreight within Brazil almost doubled between 2004 and 2013, to 408,620 tons
- •International air freight to and from Brazil expanded by 37.2% to 777,570 tons

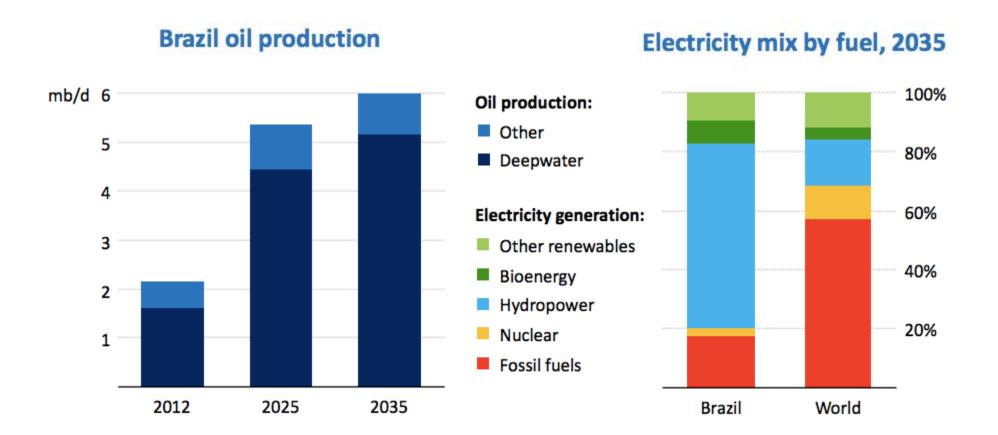

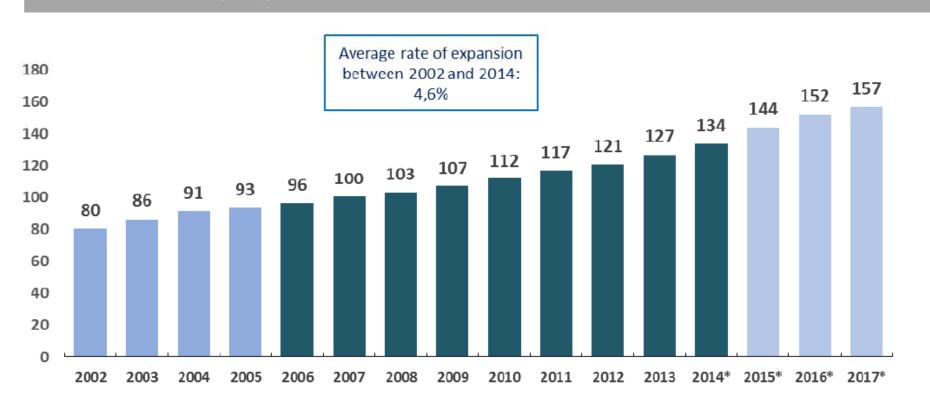

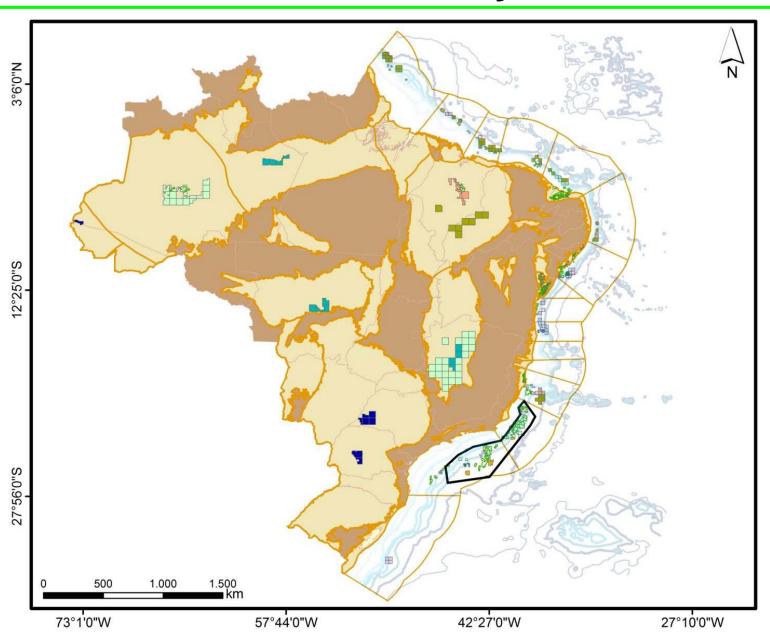

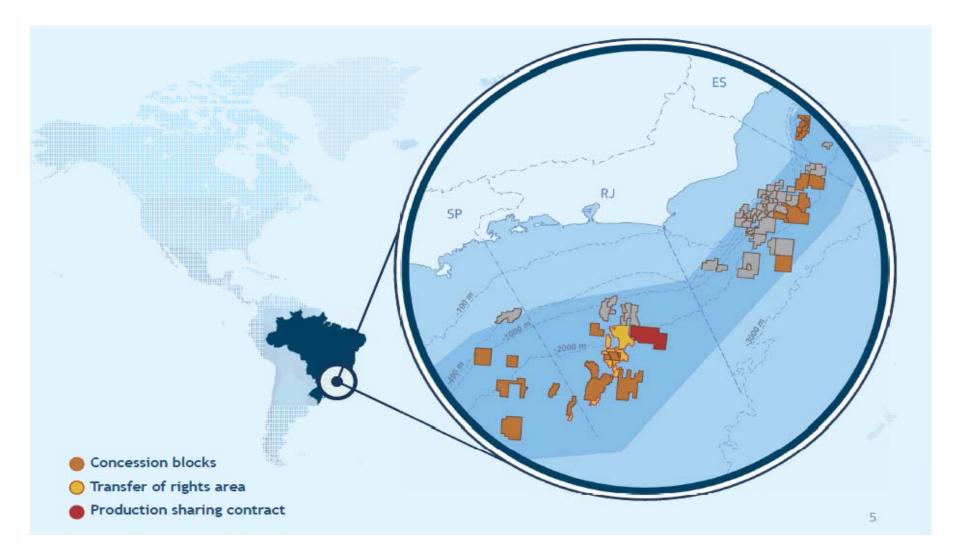

Brazil's Sedimentary Basins



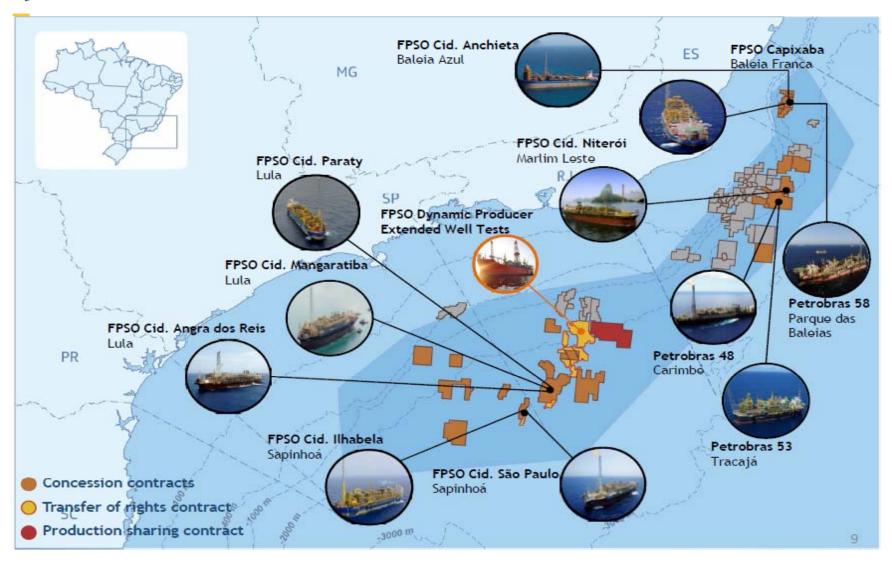
Oil & Gas: The Pre-Salt

As known, the Brazilian Pre-Salt was discovered in 2006 and covers an area of 149,000 square kilometers

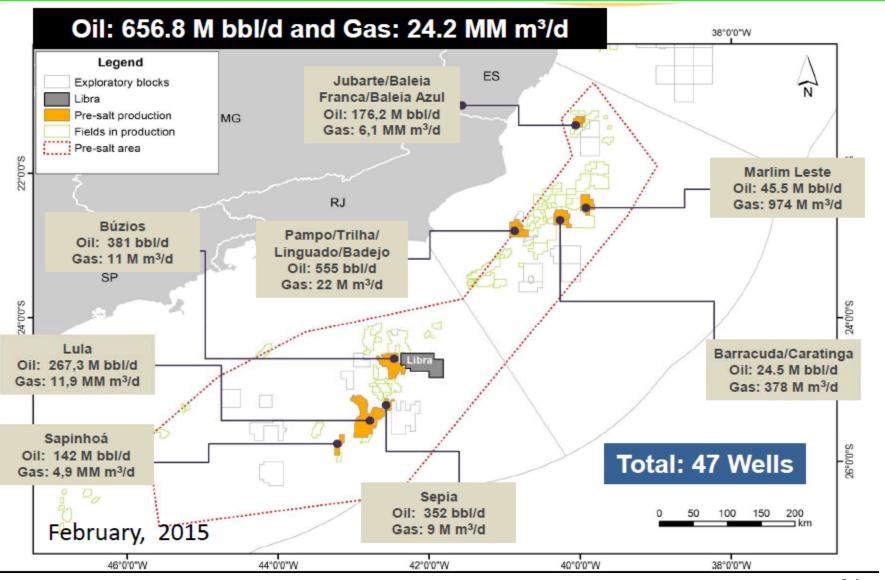


Oil & Gas: The Pre-Salt

Petrobras quer plataforma gigante

UNIDADE EM ESTUDO TERIA CAPACIDADE PARA PRODUZIR 225 MIL BARRIS DE PETRÓLEO POR DIA

Petrobras estuda a construção de uma plataforma gigante de produção de petróleo para o campo de Libra, no pré-sal da Bacia de Santos. A unidade em estudo teria capacidade para produzir 225 mil barris de petróleo e 18 milhões de metros cúbicos de gás natural por dia. Hoje, as maiores unidades em operação no Brasil podem produzir 180 mil barris de petróleo e 8 milhões de metros cúbicos de gás natural por dia.

No mundo, as maiores plataformas estão instaladas na costa oeste da África -o campo de Dalia, em Angola, por exemplo, tem uma plataforma de 240 mil barris por dia.

A busca por plataformas de maior porte tem por objetivo reduzir custos e garantir capacidade de processamento dos grandes volumes de petróleo e gás dos poços do pré-sal.



A licitação para plataforma gigante já foi iniciada e deve entrar em operação em 2019
